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SPEAKERS AND LECTURERS

prof. Mgr. Jaroslav Miller, M.A., Ph.D.

Jaroslav is a professor of history and rector at Palacký University in Olomouc. His focus is urban studies, the history of political thought and more recently also issues related to Czech and Slovak exile.

Kristýna Hrubanová

Kristýna used to teach English and Civics at different schools (primary schools, secondary schools, university). She works in [NaZemi](#) since 2010, when she started to focus on Global Development Education. She is an author of many publications, she leads courses on critical thinking and she is a facilitator. Currently she is a director of the organization.

Helena Škrdlíková

Helena is one of the founding members of Udržitelný Palacký. She studies environmental studies and devotes her free time to activities which promote zero waste and eco-friendly lifestyle. She writes a [blog Czech Zero Waste](#) and currently works as an intern in [The Institute of Circular Economy](#).

Udržitelný Palacký (Sustainable Palacký) is a student initiative which aims to make Palacký University more sustainable. Their projects are focused on improving environmental sustainability at the university itself and promoting sustainable lifestyle for students.

Petr Bittner

Petr is a political philosopher and journalist. He worked at the *Government Council for Equality of Women and Men*. He was part of the campaign *To je rovnost! (That's an equity!)* that aimed at the prevention of domestic violence and the promotion of work–life balance. He delivered workshops in schools and other public places (e.g. homes for elderly).

Radan Šafařík

Radan studied law and international relations. After studies he started to work at [The Government Council for Equal Opportunities of Women and Men](#). Currently he is a head of the Council and also the head of the *To je rovnost! (That's an Equity!)* campaign. He regularly attends conferences and seminars and comment the positions of women in society in media.



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LOGISTICAL INFORMATION

ACCOMMODATION

- You will be accommodated in [Hotel Palác](#), not far from the train station. Check-in is from 14 a.m. and check-out from 10 a.m. The reception works non-stop. You will be accommodated in single rooms (or rooms with two beds but still individually), if you wish to share a bedroom there will be plenty of rooms with two beds.

HOW TO GET FROM AIRPORT IN PRAGUE TO OLOMOUC

- You will take the bus from the airport, it goes every 30 minutes (see schedule in attachments) from terminal 1. At the Prague train station you will take train to Olomouc (see schedule in attachments)

HOW TO GET FROM AIRPORT IN VIENNA TO OLOMOUC

- There are both direct connections and connection with one transfer in Brno. In Vienna
- Regio Jet at 15:10 Vienna airport, AN in front of the new arrivals hall. To Brno Benešova tř. Hotel Grand. You have to transfer to another bus in Brno, at the same stop you'll arrive to.

HOW TO GET FROM THE TRAINSTATION IN OLOMOUC TO HOTEL

- **TRAIN from Prague:** When you come to Olomouc, you can get to the hotel easily by the tram. From the train station take the tram 2 (direction Neředín), 3 (direction Trnkova), 4 (direction Nová ulice) or 6 (direction Nová ulice). When you come out of the building, go left, there is the stop labelled A. **DON'T CROSS THE RAILWAYS!** The tram stop is just in front of the train station building. The ticket costs 14CZK, there is a coin ticket machine at the stop. You will get off the tram on the 2nd stop ŽIŽKOVO NÁMĚSTÍ. Continue on the tram direction for about 3 minutes and on the right side there is the Palace Hotel.
- **BUS from Vienna:** You have to get to the first tram stop labelled A, right in front of the train station which is close to the bus stop (you will have it in view). Then follow the instruction above.
- You can also easily get there on foot if your luggage is not too big. (See the route [HERE](#))

USEFUL INFORMATION

Weather: you can check the weather [HERE](#). Normally it is around 10°C in March in Czech Republic, but nobody knows. It might be warmer, as we are expecting temperature close to 20°C this week, but it can change in a second...

Currency & pocket money: We are going to cover all the expenses so you don't have to bring a lot of cash, but if you wish to discover some new places, cafés etc. it is up to your decision. An average cappuccino costs 50 CZK (2 €) and in many places it is possible to pay with card.
