LAB. 1 - GLOBAL LEARNING INDICATORS

The workshop aims to support teachers committed to prepare young people for the construction of an inclusive and sustainable world. It is a matter of activating in a classroom context a didactics aimed at promoting the competences of the new active and responsible citizenship for the common good. The laboratory will attempt to demonstrate how in practice, in daily teaching activity, the teacher can achieve this educational goal through UDA (Learning Unit). The text that will be illustrated in the laboratory presents some paths already experimented in class and characterized by cultural paradigms that build the new forma mentis of the global citizen of the third millennium. Particular attention will be given to the didactical application of ECG (Education for World Citizenship) competences such as interdependence, transcalarity, decentralization, responsibility and critical mind, that will give students the ability to solve tasks in situation or tasks in reality by examining local problems in a global perspective in order to conduct responsible actions towards sustainability and collective well-being.







LAB 2 – INTERNATIONAL INEQUALITIES IN THE GLOBAL GEOHISTORY MANUALE AND RELATED TLUs: APPLICABILITY IN DISTANCE EDUCATION

This seminar will provide basic knowledge of the effects of global change on terrestrial and aquatic ecosystems.

- How cold is ice?
- Goodbye to ice: What will happen to the sea when all the polar ice has melted?
- Towards a new Ice Age? Effects of global warming on ocean circulation
- Climate change: travelling inside an ice core
- Water as food: Does water taste? How to read a label
- And as if by magic the dirty water goes away: the discovery of a water purification plant.
